INGREDIENTS:

Dry Mixture

- 2 cups quick-cook oats (see notes on quick-cook vs. rolled)
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- ¹/₄ tsp salt
- ¹/₃ cup packed brown sugar

Wet Mixture:

- 2 cups nonfat milk
- 2 eggs
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp vanilla extract
- 3 tbsps honey
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp melted butter
- + 2 cups frozen mixed berries
- ¹/₄ cup pecans, separated

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 375 degrees.
- In a medium sized bowl, mix together the oats, baking powder, cinnamon, salt, and brown sugar. Set aside.
- In a seperate bowl whisk together the milk, eggs, vanilla, honey, and butter.
- Layer half the berries in a 2 quart baking dish and top evenly with the dry oat mixture. Pour on the wet mixture, then add the rest of the berries on top along with the roughly chopped pecans.
- Bake for 15-20 minutes or until the oats have absorbed the liquid. Serve hot or cold!

NOTES:

If using non-quick cook oats, increase your baking time to 35-40 minutes.

impressionable from age 10 -14. You can experience a lot of personalities and learn to get along with just about anyone covering that kind of terrain!


What are your hobbies/interests?





SECURITY & SAFETYNEWS



FEBRUARY IS THE MONTH TO THINK OF YOUR LOVED ONES. PLEASE MAKE SURE YOU TEST YOUR SMOKE DETECTORS AND YOUR ALARM SYSTEM TO KEEP THEM SAFE. THIS IS A GREAT TIME TO SURVEY YOUR HOME AND ASK YOURSELF WHAT COULD YOU DO TO BETTER PROTECT YOUR LOVED ONES.



Do you have all of your important papers up to date (will, living will, life insurance, emergency call list for alarm system, etc)? When is the last time you checked all the windows in the home to ensure that they still open and are locked? After you have had visitors, one could have been left unlocked. Check your spare house keys to make sure they are still where you left them. This might also be a good time to think about an automatic lock with a combination for the front entry door.

Outdoor motion lights are a great deterrent to vandals. Check them to make sure they are set to come on if someone walks in front of them. Make sure the bulbs are still good. Outside devices do not last as long as the inside ones, due to the weather and sun.

Neighborhoods are great if you know your neighbors. Did someone move into the neighborhood? Introduce yourself and get to know them. It will be fun and rewarding. Are their vacant homes in your area? Walk by and see if anybody has been hanging out by them and alert the police. A vigilant neighbor is the best. The police do a great job, but we can always help to provide information on what we see.

Electronic alarm systems are great for detecting someone trying to break into a home. These should be tested monthly. If your system is more than two years old, check your wireless cell dialer on the alarm. AT&T and other providers have discontinued supporting 2G cellular dialers. Make sure your alarm company has updated yours to 4G, or it won't work. Security centers offer a complimentary check for your peace of mind. It is also a good idea to check your cameras and clean the lenses on a monthly basis to get a clear picture if something were to happen. Check your shrubbery and trees to see if you need to trim them to get a better picture with your cameras.

Stay vigilant and keep your neighborhood safe, as it should be.

WASHING MACHINE HOSES

This is a common and preventable loss. Replace your rubber hoses with quality stainless steel hoses sold at Home Depot or Lowes. A busted water hose can cause costly damage that requires weeks of construction.

BATH TUB/SHOWER GROUT LEAKS

Deterioration of caulking and grout around sinks, bath-tubs and showers are common and often cause leaks over a period of time. Tearing out walls to remove unhealthy mold is often the result, so consider caulking around these areas yearly.

TOILET PROBLEMS

Toilet leaks are frequent causes of major home damage. Consider changing your inside tank valve since water eventually deteriorates the parts, plus check your toilet for looseness where the bowl attaches to the floor, including the wax ring, which can allow water to seep from under the toilet if not sealed properly.

HOT WATER HEATER OR TANKLESS HEATER LEAKS

Water heaters start off with small leaks then may ultimately burst causing major damage to the home. Consider flushing your hot water heater tank twice a year, but check it regularly for leaks and corrosion. Water heaters have a life span of approximately eight years.

ELECTRICAL FIRES

Residential fires are common due to wiring defects that go unnoticed. You should check wall receptacles and lighting fixtures and be aware of overloaded circuit breakers. Having a certified electrician check your home for safety is always recommended.

COOKING OR CANDLE FIRES

Cooking and candle fires are second to water damage claims and the leading cause of home fire injuries followed by heating equipment. Use battery operated candles and avoid open flames.

THEFT AND VANDALISM

Theft and vandalism are personal, so consider reducing your risk by installing an alarm system and/or security cameras. SUSTAINING YOUR VALENTINE'S DAY BOUQUET

As Valentine's Day approaches, stores are stocked with heart-shaped boxes of chocolates, cards, teddy bears and - the quintessential Valentine's gift flowers. A bouquet of fresh, fragrant flowers is both beautiful and pricey, so prolong the life of your blooms this year by showing them some love with the following tips:

TRIM THE STEMS

As soon as possible upon receiving your bouquet, trim the stems an inch or two

PICK A VASE

Select a vase large enough for your bouquet so you are not crowding too many flowers into the vase. Be sure your vase has first been washed in hot, soapy water and well rinsed to remove any microorganisms from prior arrangements. To ensure a spotless environment, wipe the inside of the vase with white vinegar or a touch of bleach. Next, fill your vase threequarters full with tap or distilled water. Do not use softened water, as its sodium content is too high for flowers. Place your arrangement in a cool location, away from heat sources and direct sunlight.

NOURISH YOUR BLOOMS

The best approach to feeding your bouquet is one that adequately nourishes the flowers while minimizing the growth of microorganisms and bacteria. There are many old wives' tales about the best way to supplement your flowers' water. Some claim you should add a little sugar or lemon-lime soda to the water. Although sugar provides sustenance for the flowers, it also encourages the growth of harmful microbes. Most florists recommend simply using the standard packet of flower food that comes with the bouquet. Flower food is specially formulated to nourish flowers with easily absorbable nutrients while also decreasing the pH of the water to slow the growth of bacteria.

This year, give some extra lovin' to your flowers and extend the life of your Valentine's Day bouquet!

from the bottom under running water. Doing so prevents air pockets from forming in the stems and inhibiting water intake. Using a very sharp knife or garden shears, cut the stems at a 45-degree angle to increase the surface area for maximum water absorption. Prune any leaves or other greenery that would be submerged in the water so they do not decay and plug the stems. To keep your flowers drinking at an optimal rate, continue to trim an inch off the stems every other day.
