# WORKING PART-TIME IN RETIREMENT Can Impact Your Finances in Surprising Ways

Traditionally, retirement means leaving the workforce to pursue decades of relaxation. However, today's retirees and pre-retirees are reshaping what it means to leave the workforce. Retirement may be an opportunity to pursue a small business, start consulting or land a side job that explores your passions. If your next phase includes earning an income, there are some financial considerations to keep in mind:

#### Social Security could be reduced. If

you haven't yet reached full retirement age (65 or older) and already collect benefits, the wages you earn through continued work could result in reduced Social Security payments. In 2017, an individual earning more than \$16,920 who hasn't reached full retirement age will see a \$1 reduction in Social Security benefits for every \$2 earned above that level. The earnings limit is higher in the year you reach full retirement age, and no longer applies after you reach full retirement age. If you haven't already claimed Social Security, you may wish to delay your benefits to earn a higher amount later in life.

Prepare for higher taxes. If you are

taking income from retirement accounts or generating earnings from your savings or investments, at least some of that money is subject to tax. Earning income from work may move you into a higher marginal tax bracket, meaning those distributions and investment earnings could be taxed at a higher rate. Be prepared for a potential bump in your tax bill.

Keep saving money. Ongoing work may allow you to preserve your retirement savings for later in life and even continue to build those savings. As long as you have earned income, you can put money away in tax-advantaged retirement plans. This includes an employer-sponsored plan, if it is available to you, a traditional IRA, or a Roth IRA. Contributions to traditional IRAs can only continue up to the year in which you turn 70-1/2. If you earn income past that point, you may be able to continue making contributions to a Roth IRA indefinitely, based on your income level.

#### Pay attention to health insurance.

Even if you retain health care coverage from an employer, you should consider signing up for Medicare Part A at age 65. There is generally no cost, and it provides coverage for care in hospitals and other institutions. Talk to your employer about whether you should sign up for Medicare Part B (a monthly premium applies). You may

be able to delay doing so if you are covered by your employer's plan without being subject to a 10 percent annual penalty for delaying enrollment in Part B. Check the rules carefully before you turn 65.

Whatever your motivation for continuing to earn a paycheck, the income you earn could impact several aspects of your financial life. Evaluating and planning for the effects working will have on your finances may help you feel more confident about living decades in retirement.







Q. Should I have my irrigation turned on?


A. With all the rain I'd let your lawn dry out for a least 5 days. Too much water can create weeds in your lawn. Make sure to turn your rain gage on.

a mentor named Charlotte who is in the Guinness Book of World Records and we hosted several "Duck Fests" where collectors came from five to seven states to sell and talk about rubber ducks. She has a wonderful site called **Duckplanet** where people share their collections from all over the world. Family members would find them for me for the holidays and never once called me duckin' nuts (to my face). I sold on eBay until about 2014 when a move and a new job took a lot of my time.

When I downsized and moved last year, I donated many of my ducks to churches who made Christmas boxes for children from all over the world. I knew I would not have room to display 3500 rubber ducks in my Florida home, so now I "only" have about 1200. I still have boxes full of extras that I give to fussy children on a plane or as gifts to friends. Do I still buy new ones? Yes, but only if they are really funny or old.



That doesn't even include what students are missing! You can purchase or collect needed supplies and drop them off at the front office of any school.

If gathering pencils, paper, glue, tissues, scissors, folders, and crayons won't fit your busy schedule, consider dropping off an Amazon or Walmart gift card instead. Even a card in the amount of \$10 will be put to good use!

The internet has done a phenomenal job of connecting communities. There are websites such as **adoptaclassroom.org** and **donorschoose.org** 

that can be searched by school or city and you can pick which project to donate to. If you have a Facebook account there is a sell/buy/trade group called Volusia County Florida Teachers: Buy, Sell, Trade, Search and Giveaway where teachers ask for supplies either they or their students are in need of.

If you'd prefer a paid position, consider becoming a school bus driver or a substitute teacher. These are positions that are extremely short-staffed. Bonus: these positions are part-time with summers off, too!

It takes a village. Our "village" is Venetian Bay. We can raise today's youth to be the upstanding citizens we know they are capable of being. We can all be teachers by helping the ones who head the classrooms. As our neighborhood kids exit the pools and summertime fun and head back to press pencils to paper, let's thank the people who make that possible. Thank the teachers and thank your neighbors!

# TAKE YOUR SEAT OR DISEMBARK!"

Before we dive into this month's topic, I'd like to review some vocabulary. Today I am writing about service animals, not therapy dogs. A therapy dog is trained to provide affection, comfort, and love to people in hospitals, retirement and nursing homes, schools, hospices, and disaster areas. In contrast, a service animal is defined by Title II and Title III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) as "an animal that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual or other mental disability."

So now that we are clear on that distinction, imagine this:

You are walking down the aisle of your airplane trying to find your assigned seat. As you arrive at your bought-and-paid-for seat, you notice a man holding a large parrot sitting across the aisle. In front of you, a teenager is seated with a small pig on a leash in his lap. Behind you is a woman coddling a little white rabbit. Then you notice an older woman moving to take her seat next to you, holding a large cage. Inside it lies a snake.

You get the flight attendant's attention and tell her that you are uneasy sitting with all of these animals surrounding you. She replies, "These passengers are permitted by law to have their service animals with them, to assist in their "flight anxiety." Take your seat or disembark!"

This situation and the flight attendant's response is not an exaggeration - it can happen. The animals described are called "emotional support animals" and are used by people with flying stress, fear of heights, anxiety with crowds or other types of mental illness or distress. Delta Airlines said it flew 250,000 animals in those categories last year, up 150 percent from 2016.

Though the Americans with Disabilities Act defines service animals specifically as trained dogs, cats, or miniature horses, airlines are bound by more liberal laws. The Air Carrier Access Act

of 1986 allows free travel for "any animal" that is trained to assist a person with a disability or that provides emotional support.

All airlines can require passengers with creature companions to produce a certifying letter from a physician or mental health professional, but the documents are easily forged or obtained from websites that provide cursory, questionnaire-style "exams." As a result, there is a widespread perception among airlines that some fliers are "fraudulently taking advantage of the federal law to bring untrained pets of myriad species into crowded cabins." The result, airline officials complain, has been a surge in poorly trained animals that have turned some flights into airborne menageries with dogs blocking beverage carts, cats urinating on seats, and ducks wandering the aisles.

It is impossible to determine the number of flights that have unqualified service animals on board. Other airlines have not released their own figures, and the Department of Transportation says it does not collect data on service and support animals on U.S. flights. But the agency's reports on disability-related complaints show that those involving service animals nearly quadrupled between 2012 and 2016 when more than 2,300 were filed.

Scrutiny of service animals is also sharpening on the ground: nineteen states now have laws that criminalize passing off pets as service animals. Enforcing the law is difficult and increases opportunities for lawsuits. Now, airlines are hoping to align their practices with the ADA by limiting permitted species. Some disability supporters suggest defining "emotional support animals" as only dogs and cats; others want to allow rabbits, household birds, and some barnyard animals.

Delta now has requirements effective March 1, 2017, that stipulate "passengers with **trained service animals"** will need to submit a veterinary health form at least 48 hours before travel to the airline's new Service Animal Support Desk. These support desks are estimated to cost Delta \$5 million to maintain in each airport it serves. Customers with emotional support animals or psychiatric service animals must do the same, but must also provide a signed letter from a doctor or mental health professional stating that the animal is trained to behave in public (**Delta also recently expanded its list of prohibited critters, including "farm poultry," hedgehogs, and anything with tusks.)**.

The rise in emotional support animals has coincided with the growing publicity of the mental health benefits of pets — an idea researchers say is poorly substantiated through studies but widely embraced by the public. Many owners of legitimate emotional support animals say they, like service animal owners, greatly depend on their companions and face undue suspicion due to fakers and forgers. Unfortunately, like other American freedoms,

unsavory individuals seem to be taking advantage of the privilege of the health benefits of pet ownership.

Do you as a paying airline passenger have the right to not sit next to someone with a duck, rabbit, snake, pig or another farm animal? No – because of the way the law reads today – but you do have a choice! Take your seat or disembark.

Hopefully, you will not one day have your travel plans interrupted because you are sitting next to a pig, peacock, snake, rabbit, or another farm animal currently deemed acceptable by the current law. Good luck.


